## Guidelines for your count

- Please count the birds at your chosen site for  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour between 8 17 February 2019.
- We would recommend that the count takes place at first light to see maximum activity.
- If possible, the count should take place in clear dry weather. Please do not count in the fog.
- Your count area should be approx.. 2ha and ideally it should all be visible from one vantage point.
- Only record the highest number of each bird species you see at the same time. Don't count the total over the half hour as you may get the same birds visiting more than once.
- Only count those birds within your survey area/ field.
